

Step 12: Position the third fabric piece next to Sec. 3.

Step 13: Slide the fabric under Sec. 3. Line the sew-side up with the raw edge of the trimmed quarter-inch seams allowance.

Step 14: Open the paper and sew on Line 2. The stitches should start and stop about 1/8" past the beginning and the end of each stitch line.

Step 15: Flip the paper over and press the fabric pieces to the open position on the *right-side* of the fabric.

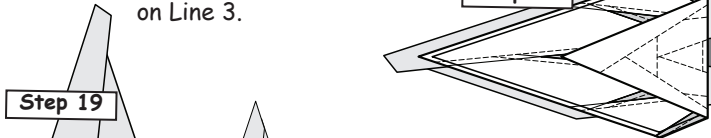
Repeat the Previous Steps: Continue with the foundation paper piecing, repeating Steps 10-15, as you add each piece to the foundation paper.



Step 16: Fabric #4 is a very small piece. You will need to tear the paper along both Lines 4 & 5 before the paper will fold back enough to allow for the trimming.

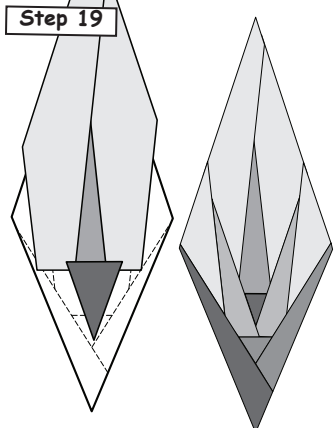
Step 17: Place the fold Template on Line 3, Fold back the paper and trim a quarter-inch seam allowance.

Step 18: Position the cut fabric pieces for Section 4 as shown, then slide it under Sec. 4. Take to your machine and sew on Line 3.



Step 19: Flip the paper over and press the fabric pieces to the open position on the *right-side* of the fabric.

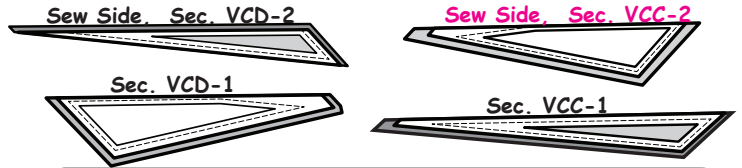
When the piecing is finished, the excess fabric and paper is trimmed off the edge of the foundations paper. There are two solid lines printed around the perimeter of each unit. The outside line is the trim line. The paper is not removed at this time.



Sorting and Stacking
VC-Unit C, VC-Unit D: Bag #2

Before you begin paper piecing, match the templates and fabric pieces in Bag #2 up with the Sec. #s on the foundation papers.

Sorting: Only two fabric pieces are sewn onto each foundation unit. Sort the pieces facing *right-side-up* for each section and place with the respective units. *Remember that there are two color ways!*



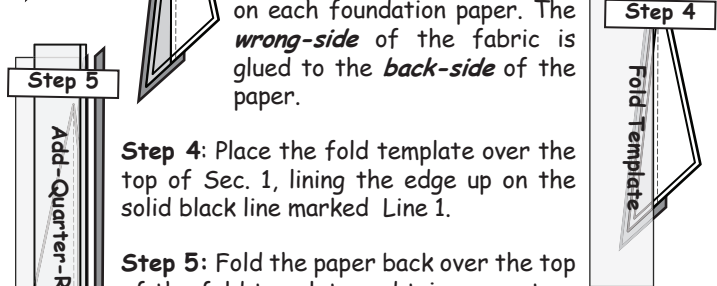
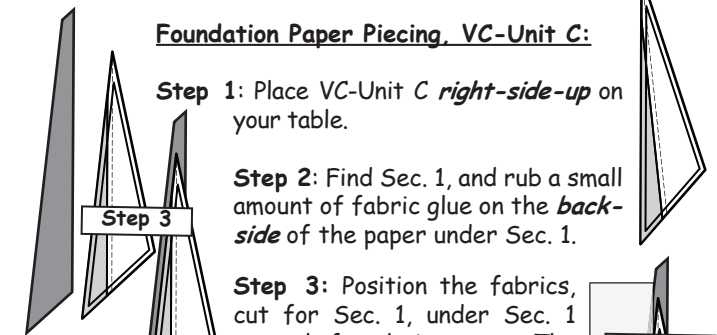
Foundation Paper Piecing: Bag #2

Foundation Paper Piecing, VC-Unit C:

Step 1: Place VC-Unit C *right-side-up* on your table.

Step 2: Find Sec. 1, and rub a small amount of fabric glue on the *back-side* of the paper under Sec. 1.

Step 3: Position the fabrics, cut for Sec. 1, under Sec. 1 on each foundation paper. The *wrong-side* of the fabric is glued to the *back-side* of the paper.



Step 4: Place the fold template over the top of Sec. 1, lining the edge up on the solid black line marked Line 1.

Step 5: Fold the paper back over the top of the fold template and trim a quarter-inch seam allowance.

Step 6: Place the fabric piece cut for Sec. 2, *right-side-up* next to the folded back paper. *Four (4) pieces were cut from Fabric #11, the other (4) were cut from Fabric #12.*

Step 7: Lift the foundation paper and slide the fabric under Sec. 2. Line the sew-side up with the trimmed seam allowance, making sure the fabric extends beyond the boundaries of the finishing cut line. Open the paper and sew on Line 1.

Note: Loosen the glue under Sec. 1 before you press.

Step 8: Flip the paper over and press the fabric pieces to the open position on the *right-side* of the fabric. Trim off the excess fabric and paper from around the edge of the foundations paper.

Do not remove the foundation paper at this time.
