


## BASTING UNIT B2, BAG 5

**Step 1:** Position the fabric strips cut from Fabric B1 on your table facing **wrong-side-up** as shown. These are found in Bag #5.




**Step 2:** The Foundation Papers (Unit B2) are placed facing **right-side up [printed-side-up]** onto the **wrong-side** of the fabric. These pieces are directional. If you cut them out wrong, they will be backward and you will need to start over. Glue should be placed around the edge on the backside of the paper before placing them onto the fabric. Several flower pins are used to keep each of the papers attached to the fabric.



**Step 3:** You will need to cut around each of the foundation papers to separate the pieces. A rough cut around each piece is all that is necessary at this time. They will be trimmed to fit the paper in Step 6.

**Step 4:** Locate the [RP.....] lines along the edge of your paper.





**Step 5:** A basting stitch [stitch length 3.5] is sewn the length of the dots on each (RP) line.

**Step 6:** After the (RP) lines are sewn on to each of the B2 Units the excess fabric is trimmed off to fit the paper. Place the pieces back into Bag #5. Do not remove the paper.

## CLAMSHELL: GROUP C: CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS BAGS 6 AND 7

### ► Foundation Papers and Templates:

**Step 1:** Cut out (8) each of the Foundation Papers for Unit C1 and C2, on NP 398, along with (1) each of the Template Layout Sheets on TP 219. See the following newsprint graphics for information on how to organize your units and templates into their corresponding bags. \*Refer back to General Information for Foundation papers and templates for additional instructions on how to prepare your foundation papers and templates.



### ► Clamshell Fabric Information:

The table in the next column includes yardage, Fabric numbers, and a reference to which fabrics go with the Templates and (TLS) to complete Units C1 and C2. This table is your guide for not only selecting your own colors, but keeping you organized. Don't forget to cut a swatch of your chosen fabric to paste in the box in the Assigned Colors column! This will help you stay organized!
