

**Step 3:** Position two *AB Strip Piecing Templates* on top each stack and use them to cut **(2)** pieces from each strip. Clip the remaining end pieces together and set aside at this time.




**Step 4:** The SP-Template pieces are re-stacked into the sewing order starting with Fabric S4 on the bottom ending with Fabric S1 on the top. A paper clip should be used to keep each group together. Place these pieces in Bag AB-1 with **(4)** Foundation Sheets AB1. At this point, you can also label your papers if you would like. If you intend to chain piece them all at once, this might be a good idea. Just label them as AB1-1 to AB1-4 (then the next group would be AB2-1 to AB2-4, and so forth). Since you are only working with **(4)** papers at a time, labeling might not be necessary. It is up to you!




**Step 5:** Repeat the same cutting instructions for each Foundation Sheet AB2, AB3, and AB4. When you are done cutting, clip the fabrics and papers together and place back into Bag #AB-1. When you are done with the papers in Bag #AB-1, continue with the Foundation Sheets in Bag #AB-2. Graphics are shown on the following page.


## ► Foundation Sheet AB2: Bag #AB-1



### ► Foundation Sheet AB3: Bag #AB-1







**Step 6:** When you are done cutting and sorting the papers in Bag #AB-1, continue with the Foundation Sheets in Bag #AB-2.


