

CHAPTER TWO: GROUP B: WEDDING STAR CENTERS AND MELONS

Foundation Papers: The following newsprint should be included in your pattern to complete the Wedding Star Centers and Melon Units. Page 1 of your pattern explains the number of newsprint included in your pattern. The Wedding Star Cutting Chart to the right shows the number of foundation units and templates you need to cut of each sheet for the table topper size. (LINE 3 = UNIT CDS, LINE 4 = UNIT CMS, LINE 5 FOR UNIT M) Place the papers in the proper bags per the graphic below:





GENERAL UNIT TECHNIQUES

Foundation Paper Piecing: The technique of Foundation Paper piecing involves sewing fabrics to a foundation of paper that has preprinted lines and sewing instructions. This allows for perfect points and seam allowances when piecing an intricate quilting design. Oversized pieces of fabric are sewn under each section on the foundation paper, then trimmed down to the proper size.

Floating Points: Floating points are designed so the tip of the point does not intersect with a seam allowance. Floating a point is a "forgiving" way to piece unit/blocks together because nothing is designed to match up. The most critical step to floating a point is learning how to tear back the foundation paper when adding the next piece.

Cutting Techniques: Efficiency has also been incorporated into our cutting techniques. With these instructions, we will introduce you to pre-cutting techniques using Template Layout Sheets. If these concepts are new, you will find them to be time saving and efficient.

Curved Piecing: We approach curved piecing differently than the traditional way of clipping and pinning. Pins and glue are applied to the seam allowance to hold the fabrics in place along the raw edges, which helps ensure a perfect fit when sewing with a quarter-inch seam allowance.

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
