

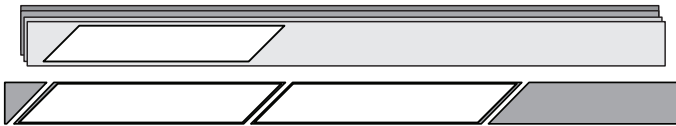
► Cutting Strips:

Step 1: One 2-1/2" by 42" strip is cut for each Fabric #, for a total of (16) strips. (The same fabrics can be used in multiple spots.)

Step 2: The *strips* are pressed open and stacked *right-side-up* with *Fabric S16* on the bottom, ending with *Fabric S1* on the top.

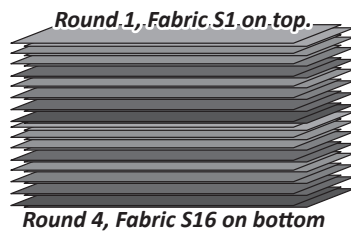

Step 3: Position *Strip Template S-1* on top of your stack, as shown, and cut (2) pieces from each strip, repositioning the template for the next cut.



Step 4: Create (4) groups (labeled *Rounds 1-4*), (8) strips each, made up of (2) strips each of (4) Fabric #s. (See *Step 3: Stacking Graphic* in the next column). Clip each round together.

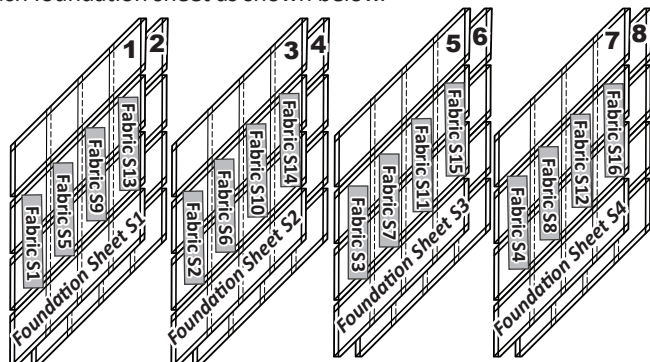
Step 5: The clipped fabric strips are now stacked together in order starting with Round 4 on the bottom, and finishing with Round 1 on the top. The strip piecing process is designed to add each piece of fabric to the foundation papers in the sequence in which the fabrics are stacked. The process is very simple if you follow the sewing order provided for each **Round 1-4** on the following pages.



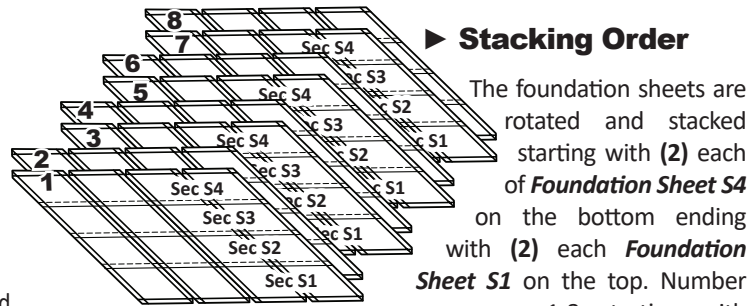
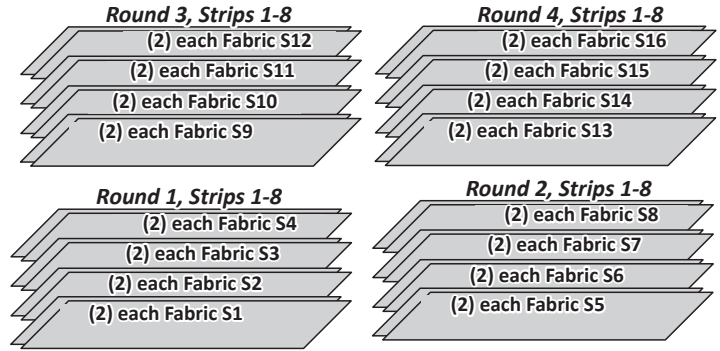
► Preparing your Foundation Papers:

Step 1: You have (2) each of Foundation Sheets S1-S4. Position them print-side up on your table as shown below.

Step 2: Fabric swatches from each color are cut and pasted onto each foundation sheet as shown below.



Step 3: Stacking Graphic, Rounds 1 to 4



► Stacking Order

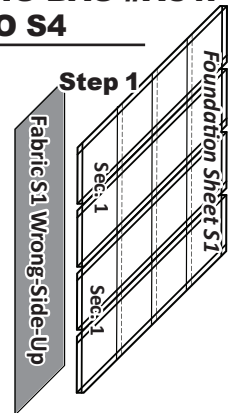
The foundation sheets are rotated and stacked starting with (2) each of *Foundation Sheet S4* on the bottom ending with (2) each *Foundation Sheet S1* on the top. Number your papers 1-8 starting with *Foundation Sheet S1* on the top. If you don't number the papers you will lose track of where you are in the instructions.

■ FOUNDATION PAPER PIECING BAG #AC1: FOUNDATION SHEETS S1 TO S4

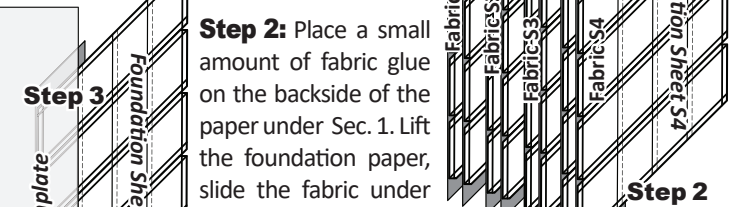
► Round 1: Strips 1-8

Reference Round 1, strips 1-8 above. The strips in the first round are glued onto the backside of each *Foundation Sheets S1-S4*.

1. Pair Fabric S1, Strip #1, to Sheet S1, Sec 1
2. Pair Fabric S1, Strip #2, to Sheet S1, Sec 1
3. Pair Fabric S2, Strip #3, to Sheet S2, Sec 1
4. Pair Fabric S2, Strip #4, to Sheet S2, Sec 1
5. Pair Fabric S3, Strip #5, to Sheet S3, Sec 1
6. Pair Fabric S3, Strip #6, to Sheet S3, Sec 1
7. Pair Fabric S4, Strip #7, to Sheet S4, Sec 1
8. Pair Fabric S4, Strip #8, to Sheet S4, Sec 1



Step 1: Place Strip #1 [Fabric S1] *wrong-side-up* on your table along the edge of *Foundation Sheet S1* as shown. Find the diamonds on the foundation paper labeled as Sec. 1.



Step 2: Place a small amount of fabric glue on the backside of the paper under Sec. 1. Lift the foundation paper, slide the fabric under the Sec. 1 diamonds and adhere the paper to *wrong-side* of the fabric. Repeat Step 1 and 2 for each *Foundation Sheet*.

Step 3: Start with *Foundation Sheet S4*, place the fold template over the top of Sec. 1, lining the edge up on the solid black line marked Line 1.
