Barrier Reef, Group D

Barrier Reef: This booklet includes the foundation papers, template layout sheets, and instructions needed to complete the cutting and piecing for Group D.

• **Group D: Unit D1 & T-Template D1**

Newsprint NP 804, and TP 604: The newsprint in your instructions package includes the Foundation Papers, and Template Layout Sheets (TLS) required to complete the cutting and piecing instructions for Unit D1 & T-Template D1.

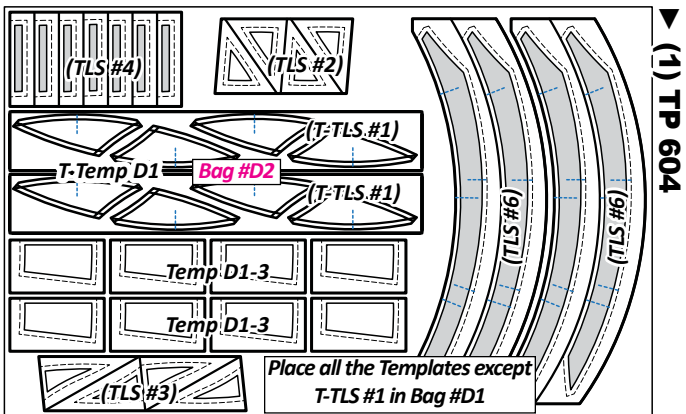
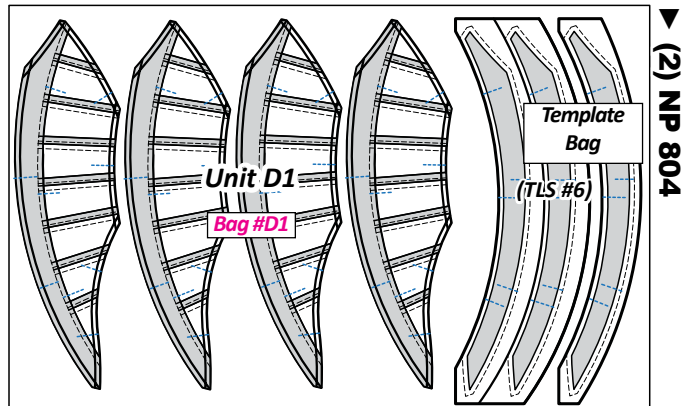
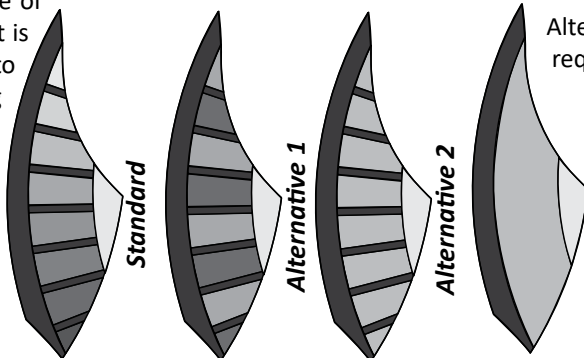
Reference Page 3 of the Introduction Booklet under ***Foundation Papers and Templates** for instructions on how to cut out the Foundation Papers, Templates, and Template Layout Sheets.

After the Foundation Papers and Template Layout Sheets are cut out, the papers labeled Unit D1 are placed into their associated Bag # listed below. The Template Layout Sheets are stacked in numerical order (TLS) #S 1-4, & #6, then placed into a temporary bag assigned to the Group D Templates. After the templates are placed with their assigned fabrics and the template cutting is completed for each fabric, the templates and fabrics are then placed with the foundation papers into their assigned Bags.

Ziploc Bags: (1) large Ziploc bags are needed to keep your fabrics, templates, and papers organized. Label as follows:

- **Bag #D1:** (8) Unit D1 Foundation Papers, TLS #2, #3, #4, and #6, and Temp D1-3.
- **Bag #D2:** (8) T-Template D1 (T-TLS #1)

Color Options: For Block D, there is the **Standard Color Option**, and three **Color Alternatives**. You should choose the standard option if you want all (8) units to look the same, or have (4) blocks and (2) Color Groups. This option allows you to color the background fabrics however you like. You can shade them from one end of the unit to the other, you can make them all the same, you can alternate fabrics. The key, is that you make at least (2) color groups or (4) or make the blocks all the same. If you want more color variation without causing high yardage calculations, choose one of the Alternatives explained as Alternatives 1, 2, or 3. It is important to note that the alternatives are not meant to be confusing, but simply offer more options, allowing you to change how you cut out the pieces to save yardage. If you want to play around with them a bit, you can use Quiltster to test out different color ideas using each alternative to see which yardage color options work the best with your ideas. Have fun with it, choose an Alternative, then simply follow those directions in the pattern. It's like a choose your own adventure approach to quilting.



- **Alternative 1:** To alternate the background fabrics and have more than (2) color groups, choose Alternative 1. This option also lets you make the Template D1-5 Sashing Strips out of different fabrics. You can do that in the Standard option as well, but the yardage required is significantly more than Alternative 1.
- **Alternative 2:** For the background sections to use all the same fabrics in one unit (pieces cut with Template D1-3), then have all the background sections in the next unit be a different fabric, choose this option. Your Template D1-5 Sashing Strips can be different as well. Use this option for the Ombre version.

• **Alternative 3:** Alternative 3 does not require piecing of Unit D1, other than to add the Template D1-5 Sashing Strip. In this option, the sashing strips must be cut from all the same fabric.
