

Barrier Reef: Includes the foundation papers, template layout sheets, and instructions

needed to complete the cutting and piecing for Group F:

Group F Unit F1

Newsprint NP 806, and TP 607: The newsprint in your instructions package includes the Foundation Papers, and Template Layout Sheets (TLS) required to complete the cutting and piecing instructions for Unit F1.

Reference Page 3 of the Introduction Booklet under *Foundation Papers and Templates for instructions on how to cut out the Foundation Papers, Templates, and Template Layout Sheets in this booklet.

After the Foundation Papers, Templates, and Template Layout Sheets are cut out, the papers labeled Unit F1 are placed into Bag # F1. The Template Layout Sheets and Templates are clipped together and placed into the same Bag with the Group F1 Units.


Ziploc Bags: (1) large Ziploc bag is needed to keep your fabrics, templates, and papers organized. Label as follows:

Bag #F1: (8) Unit F1 Foundation Papers, and associated Templates and Template Layout Sheets (TLS).

Color Options: For Block F, there is the Standard Color Option, and two *Color Alternatives*. You should choose the standard option If you want all (8) units to look the same, or have (4) blocks and (2) Color Groups. This option allows you to color the background fabrics with repeating fabrics using (8) colors. The sashing strips and vein must be the same fabric in at least (4) blocks to use your yardage optimally. If you want more color variation without causing high yardage calculations, choose one of the Alternatives explained as Alternatives 1 or 2. It is important to note that the alternatives are not meant to be confusing, but simply offer more options, allowing you to change how you cut out the pieces to save yardage. If you want to play around with them a bit, you can use Quiltster to test out different color ideas using each alternative to see which yardage color options work the best with your ideas. Have fun with it, choose an Alternative, then simply follow those directions in the pattern. It's like a choose your own

Alternative 1: To alternate the background fabrics and use (4) or (8) Color groups, choose Alternative 1. This is also

adventure approach to quilting.



the best alternative if you want your backgrounds the same across one unit, but different from unit to unit. This alternative option also reduces yardage if you want to make the Template F1-3 Vein out of different fabrics. Alternative 2:

Alternative 2 does not require piecing of Unit F1, other than to add the Template F1-3 Sashing Strip. In this option, the sashing strips must be cut from all the same fabric.

Yardage Chart Information: Please note, the yardage information presented in the Fabric Charts are for the One Color Group options, where all (8) blocks look the same. If you are choosing a design with 2 or more color groups, the total inches shown will be split between the different fabrics. In some cases, you may need to increase your yardage, if only one strip would be required to make all (8) units. In this case, you would need (2) strips to make (4) units in two different colorways.
