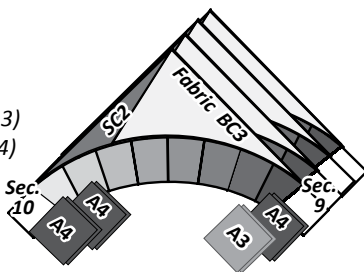


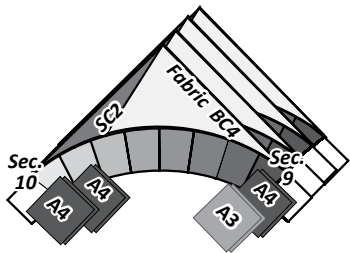
► **Unit Block 4: (6-I), (6-K)**

Unit CMS: Fabric (BC3/SC2)
 Label (2) each as
 Triangle Block 6-I: (2) each (A4/A3)
 Triangle Block 6-K: (2) each (A4/A4)
 Place into Group Bag Block 6.



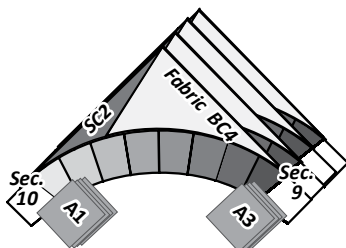
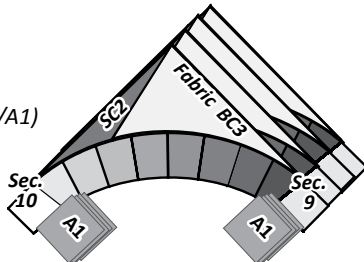
► **Unit Block 4: (6-J), (6-L)**

Unit CMS: Fabric (BC4/SC2)
 Label (2) each as
 Triangle Block 6-J: (2) each (A4/A3)
 Triangle Block 6-L: (2) each (A4/A4)
 Group Bag Block 6.



► **Unit Block 4: (7-M)**

Unit CMS: Fabric (BC3/SC2)
 Triangle Block 7-M: (4) each (A1/A1)
 Group Bag Block 7.



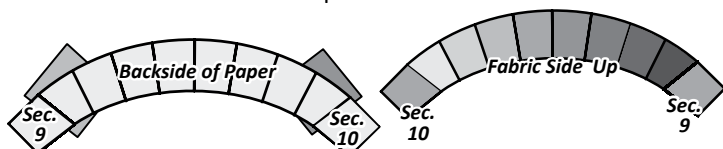
► **Unit Block 4: (7-N)**

Unit CMS: Fabric (BC4/SC2)
 Triangle Block 7-N: (4) each (A1/A3)
 Group Bag Block 7.

UNIT BLOCK 5

NOTE - Squaring Up the Quilt?: If you are interested in squaring up your quilt, the center templates must be sewn before adding the corner stones. Refer to Page 21 for additional information and piecing instructions.

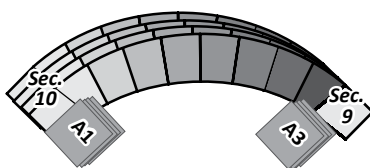
Group Bag Block 5: The Corner Stones are sewn onto each end of the Unit B arcs under Sections 9 and 10 to complete each Unit Block 5. Before the sewing is started, the corner stones are paired with each of the Unit B Groups shown below.



Step 3: When the sewing is completed, the pieces are pressed, the excess fabric is trimmed off around each corner, and the paper is removed from Unit B. The blocks in each Color Group are clipped together, labeled with the assigned **Block #-letter**, then place into the Group Bags assigned to each set of blocks.

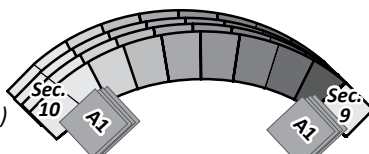
► **Unit Block 5: (8-O)**

Triangle Block 8-O: (4) each (A1/A3)
 Group Bag Block 8.



► **Unit Block 5: (8-P)**

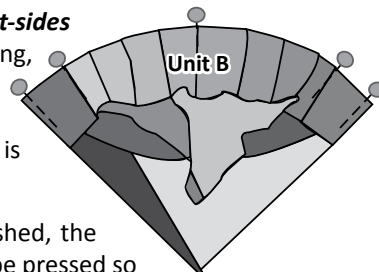
Triangle Block 8-P: (4) each (A1/A1)
 Group Bag Block 8.



► **Unit Block 6-A through 6-L:**

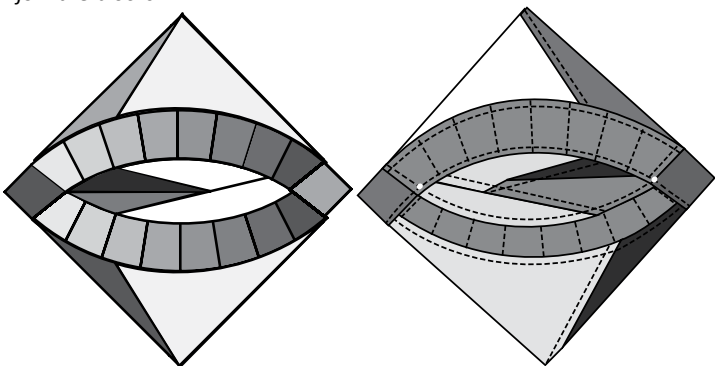
Sewing: Unit Block 1 and Unit Block 4 are sewn together to create (24) each of Unit Block 6. *The Color Groups for each block are paired before the blocks are sewn together. *Refer to the Center Block Groups 6-A through 6-H and the Triangle Block Groups 6-I through 6-L on Page 17 when pairing the Color Groups for each block.

The blocks are sewn with **right-sides facing together**. Before sewing, a pin is used to secure both points where the arcs join the corner pieces. A 1/4" seam is used to sew the curved seam.



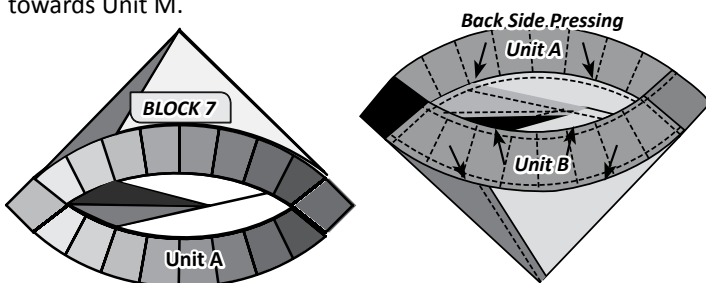
Pressing: When you are finished, the backside of each block should be pressed so the curved seams on each Unit A are pressed into the arcs and the curved seams on each Unit B are pressed away from the arcs.

NOTE - Block 6: The dashed line represents the stitching line. If you press in direction of the arrows, you will end up with opposing seams when you join the blocks.



► **Unit Block 7-M & 7-N:**

Unit Block 4 and Unit Block 2 are sewn together to create (4) each of two color groups for Unit Block 7. The curved seam is pressed towards Unit M.



► **Unit Block 8-O & 8-P:**

Unit Block 1 and Unit Block 5 are sewn together to create (4) each of two color groups for Unit Block 8. The curved seam is pressed towards Unit M.
