



Booklet Two, Picket Fence, Wall Group F

Picket Fence: Includes the foundation papers, template layout sheets, and instructions needed to complete the Border Units:

- Units FL1, FR1, FL2, FR2, FL3, & FR3: Picket Fence Border

Newsprint NP 659, NP 660, TP 474, TP 475, & TP 476: The following newsprint includes the Foundation Papers, T-Templates, and Template Layout Sheets required to complete the piecing for Group F.






The Foundation Papers, Templates and Template Layout Sheets are cut out at this time. Reference Page 3 of the Introduction Booklet under ***Foundation Papers and Templates** for instructions on how to cut out the Foundation Papers, Templates, and Template Layout Sheets.

After the paper units and templates are cut out, the foundation papers are sorted and grouped together by **Unit Name** then placed into their associated bags listed below. The T-Templates and Template Layout Sheets are clipped together and placed in a separate bag. The sorting of all the templates in each group is completed after the templates are placed with their assigned fabrics and the template cutting is completed for each fabric.


Ziploc Bags: (3) large Ziploc bags are needed to keep your fabrics, templates, and papers organized. Label as follows:

- Bag #F1: (4) each Unit FL1 & FR1, and TLS #1 to #6.
- Bag #F2: (4) each Unit FL2, FL3, FR2, FR3, and TLS #7 to #11.



- Bag #F3: (1) each T-Temp F1L, F1R, F2L, F2R, F3L, F3R and F4.

Assigned Fabric #: We have assigned Fabric #s to each of the Sec. #s on the Foundation Units. These Fabric #s pair up with the Fabric #s in Quiltster and the Fabric Charts provided in the Introduction Booklet. These Fabric #s will also be used to reference the Templates and Template Layout Sheets used to cut the fabric pieces throughout these instructions.



Fabric Layout:

Fabric-Side-Up: The fabric layout shown matches the the look of the quilt if it is right-side-up and the templates have been cut and sewn.

Fabric Swatch Chart: There are (9) fabrics listed in the Fabric Swatch Chart. A small swatch cut and pasted into the box on the chart below will keep you organized as you work through your cutting instructions. If you are using more than one fabric for each fabric reference, see the information at the bottom of Page 3 and top of Page 4 to stay organized.

GROUP F: CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Before you begin cutting fabrics, take a few minutes and cut a small fabric swatch of each color, Fabric F1-F9. It is very helpful when you paste a small swatch of fabric onto the foundation papers and their respective Template Layout Sheets. This really helps keep you organized as you complete the cutting for each of the units.

NOTE - When pre-cutting your fabric strips for the Template Layout Sheets, the pieces you cut should always measure either the same size or a little larger than the Template Layout Sheet itself.

Fabric F1: Unit FL1 & FR1 (TLS #1 & #2) (Temp FL1-5 & Temp FR1-5 for Sec. 19)

One 6-1/2" by 42" strip yields enough fabric to cut (1) piece for each (TLS) #1 and #2 (Temp) FL1-5 & FR1-5. You need (4) pieces with each template.

Color Option: If you have selected to use two or more colors for Fabric F1, you will need to adjust the cutting to accommodate the number of strips cut from each fabric color.

- **One Color Option:** Cut (4) 6-1/2" by 42" strips from Fabric F1.
- **Two Color Option:** Cut (2) 6-1/2" x 42" strips from Fabric F1:a and F1:b.
- **Four Color Option:** Cut (1) 6-1/2" x 42" strip from Fabrics F1:a, F1:b, and F1:c.

Step 1: The strips are stacked facing *right-side-up*. Position one each *Unit FL1, Template Layout Sheet #1, Unit FR1, Template Layout Sheet #2*, and one each *Template FL1-5 & FR1-5* onto your stack as shown.



Step 2: Sub-cut (4) pieces matching the size and shape of each Template & Template Layout Sheet.



Step 3: Using your ruler and rotary cutter, slice through the paper and fabric on each Cut Line to separate the individual sections.

Step 4: Clip the template and fabric pieces beneath for each Sec. # and place with the foundation papers for *Unit FR1* in Bag #F1.



Step 5: Clip the template to the fabric pieces beneath for each Sec. # and place with the foundation papers for *Unit FL1* in Bag #F1.



Fabric F2: Unit FL1(TLS #3) Unit FR1 (TLS #4)

One 6-1/2" by 42" strip yields enough fabric to cut (2) each of (TLS #3) and (TLS #4). You need (4) pieces for each template.



Choose your Color Options: If you have selected to use two or more colors for Fabric F2, adjust your cutting to accommodate the number of strips cut from each fabric color.
