

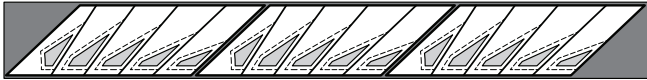
GROUP B: CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Before you begin cutting fabrics, take a few minutes to get organized. Cut and paste small fabric swatches onto the foundation papers and their respective Template Layout Sheets. A small swatch of each color, Fabric B1- B5, pasted on the Sec. # in which they will be sewn, will keep you organized. If you are cutting from more than one color, cut the fabric pieces and pasted for each

The graphics for Fabric B1 and B2 were switched in the original printing. We have moved them in this version. No text was changed, only graphics for Fabric B1 and Fabric B2 were switched.

► Fabric B1: Unit B1 (TLS #2)

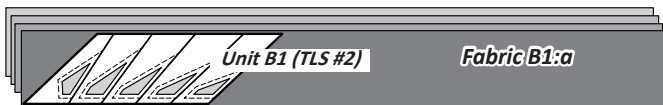
One 5" by 42" strip yields enough fabric to complete (3) Unit B1 Blocks. You need (12) Unit B Blocks.



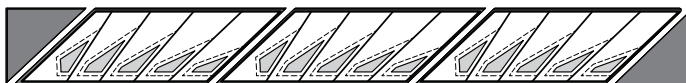
Color Options: If you have elected to use two or more colors for Fabric B1, you will need to adjust your cutting to accommodate the number of strips cut from each fabric color chosen. To determine the # of strips needed for each Color Option refer to the list below.

- **One Color Option:** Yields (12) blocks per color. Cut (4) strips from Fabric B1.
- **Two Color Option:** Yields (6) blocks per color. Cut (2) strips from each Fabric B1:a & B1:b.
- **Three Color Option:** Yields (4) blocks per color. Cut (2) strips from each Fabric B1:a, B1:b, & B1:c.
- **Four Color Option:** Yields (3) blocks per color. Cut (1) strip from each Fabric B1:a, B1:b, B1:c & B1:d.
- **Six Color Option:** Yields (2) blocks per color. Cut (1) strip from each Fabric B1:a, B1:b, B1:c, B1:d, B1:e, & B1:f.

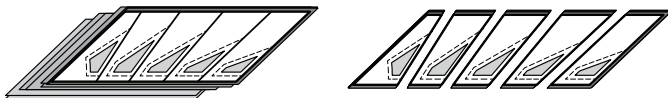
Step 1: The 5" by 42" strips are stacked facing *right-side-up* in alphabetical order starting with Fabric B1:a on the top. Position **Unit B1, Template Layout Sheet #2** onto your stack along the left edge.



Step 2: Sub-cut (12) pieces matching the size and shape of the Template Layout Sheet. Move the templates as needed. The same # of pieces are cut from each color. *Note: If you are working with six strips, (2) pieces are cut from each strip.*



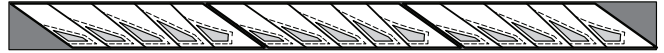
Step 3: Sort the pieces by color, then stack the (12) pieces *right-side-up* into one pile. Center the TLS onto the fabric pieces. Using your ruler and rotary cutter, slice through the paper and fabric on each Cut Line to separate the individual sections.



Step 4: A paper clip is used to keep the template and fabric pieces beneath, together into one stack. Place the pieces into Bag #B1.

► Fabric B2: Unit B2 (TLS #4)

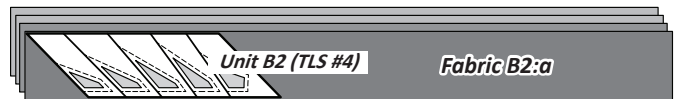
One 4-1/2" by 42" strip yields enough fabric to complete (3) Unit B2 Blocks. You need (12) Unit B Blocks.



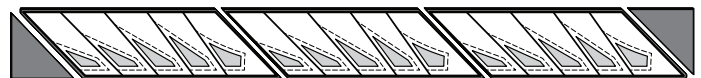
Color Options: If you have elected to use two or more colors for Fabric B2, you will need to adjust your cutting to accommodate the number of strips cut from each fabric color chosen. To determine the # of strips needed for each Color Option refer to the list below.

- **One Color Option:** Yields (12) blocks per color. Cut (4) strips from Fabric B2.
- **Two Color Option:** Yields (6) blocks per color. Cut (2) strips from each Fabric B2:a & B2:b.
- **Three Color Option:** Yields (4) blocks per color. Cut (2) strips from each Fabric B2:a, B2:b, & B2:c.
- **Four Color Option:** Yields (3) blocks per color. Cut (1) strip from each Fabric B2:a, B2:b, B2:c & B2:d.
- **Six Color Option:** Yields (2) blocks per color. Cut (1) strip from each Fabric B2:a, B2:b, B2:c, B2:d, B2:e, & B2:f.

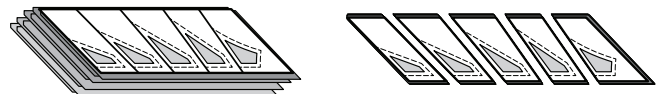
Step 5: Stack the 4-1/2" by 42" strips facing *right-side-up* in alphabetical order starting with Fabric B2:a on the top. Position **Unit B2, Template Layout Sheet #4** onto your stack along the left edge.



Step 6: Sub-cut (12) pieces matching the size and shape of the Template Layout Sheet. Move the templates as needed. The same # of pieces are cut from each color. *Note: If you are working with six strips (2) pieces are cut from each strip.*



Step 7: Sort the pieces by color, then stack the (12) pieces *right-side-up* into one pile. Center the TLS onto the fabric pieces. Using your ruler and rotary cutter, slice through the paper and fabric on each Cut Line to separate the individual sections.



Step 8: A paper clip is used to keep the template and fabric pieces beneath, together into one stack. Place the pieces into Bag #B2.

► Fabric B3: Unit B1 & B2 (TLS #5)

One 6-1/2" by 42" strip yields enough fabric to complete (12) units.



NOTE - If you have Unit B1 & B2 (TLS #5) selected two or more fabrics for Fabric B3, you will need to adjust your cutting to accommodate the number of fabric colors chosen. One strip is required for each additional color.

Step 9: Stack the strip facing *right-side-up*. Position **Unit B1 & B2**
