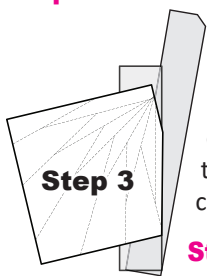
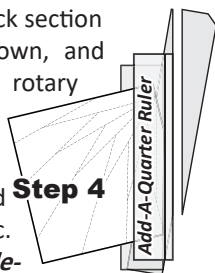


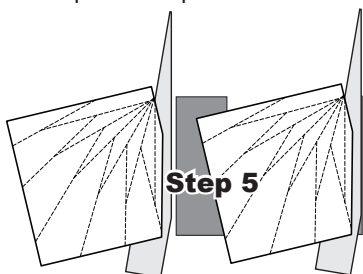
Step 3: Line the edge of the fold template up with Line 1. Fold the paper back over the top of the fold template.



Step 4: Place the *Add-A-Quarter* ruler against the edge of the folded back section on the paper, lip-side down, and trim the fabric with your rotary cutter.



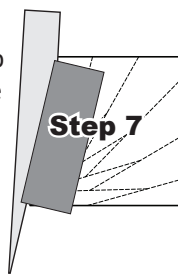
Step 5: Remove both the *Add-A-Quarter* template and position the fabric piece for Sec.



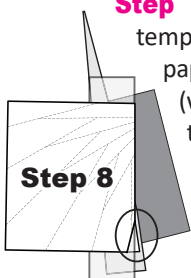
2 *right-side-up*, sliding it under Sec. 2 on the foundation paper. Line the sew-side up with the trimmed quarter-inch seam allowance.

Step 6: Open the paper and sew on Line 1.

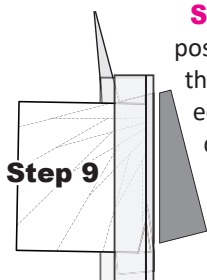
Step 7: Loosen the glue under Sec. 1, then flip the paper over and press the fabric on the backside of the paper as shown.



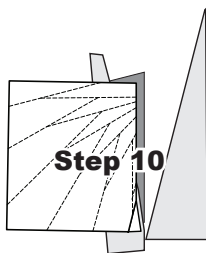
Step 8: Line the edge of the fold template up on Line 2. Tear the paper along the stitches on Line 1 (where it is circled in the graphic) to fold the paper back over the fold template. When you hit the fold template, stop!



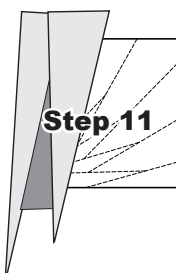
Step 9: Trim the fabric with the *Add-A-Quarter* ruler.



Step 10: Find the third piece of fabric and position it beneath your foundation paper, lining up the sew-side with the raw edge of the trimmed quarter-inch seam allowance. Open the paper and sew on Line 2, then press the seam open on the front side.



Step 11: Continue adding the fabric pieces to complete each section on the foundation paper. Make sure the fabric pieces cover the section they were intended to cover before you fold back and trim the next seam.



Step 12: Trim around the outside edge of the foundation paper to complete your blocks.
