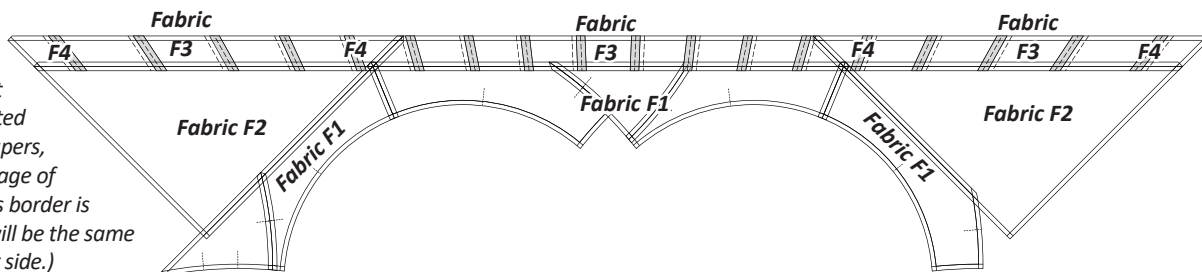


► Color Layout

NOTE - Back-side

Graphic: The color layout shown matches the Printed side of the foundation papers, which is the back side image of your quilt. (However, this border is symmetrical, so fabrics will be the same when viewed from either side.)



Fabric Information:

The *Unit Chart* below provides Fabric #s, yardage (in inches or yards), and references for matching fabrics to their respective T-Templates and (TLS) to create **Units F1, F2, & F3, and T-Templates F-1 to F-4**. The table is your guide for selecting your own colors and keeping you organized. Paste a swatch of your chosen fabric in the "Assigned Color" column for easy reference. A Color Layout at the bottom of the page offers a visual guide to the placement of each Fabric #.

Fabric F1: T-Templates F-1, F-2, & F-3	7/8 yd or (30")	Fabric Swatch
Fabric F2: T-Templates F-4	7/8 yd or (31-1/2")	Fabric Swatch
Fabric F3: Unit F1- F3, (TLS #1, #2, #3, #4)	3/4 yd or (24")	Fabric Swatch
Fabric F4: Unit F1-F3, (TLS #5 & #6)	3/8 yd or (12")	Fabric Swatch

NOTE - Repositionable Glue: Apply repositionable glue to the backside of each template to prevent the TLS from shifting during cutting. This allows you to remove and reposition the template as needed. For larger templates, it is recommended to use flower pins in combination with the glue to further secure the template and prevent shifting during sewing.

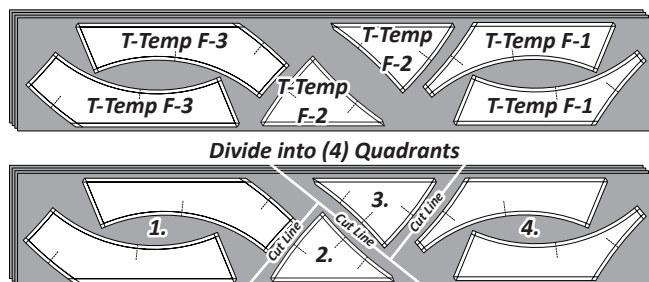
NOTE - Fabric Glue: Is used to secure the smart corners and raw edge when fitting two pieces of fabric together before sewing a seam.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

► Fabric F1: T-Templates F-1, F-2, & F-3

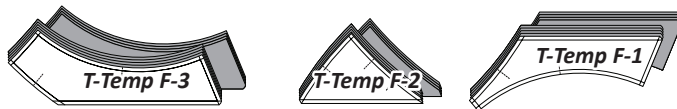
Step 1: Cut (4) strips measuring 7-1/2" by 42" from Fabric F1. Stack the strips **right-side-up**.

Step 2: Cutting T-Templates F-1, F-2, and F-3: Arrange the templates as shown in the diagram. Cut the strips into four quadrants.



- **First Quadrant:** Use **T-Template F-3** to cut (8) pieces. Cut (4) pieces, reposition the template, and cut another (4) pieces.
- **Second & Third Quadrants:** Use **T-Template F-2** to cut (8) pieces. Cut (4) pieces from the second quadrant, reposition, and cut (4) more pieces from the third quadrant.
- **Forth Quadrants:** Use **T-Template F-1** to cut (8) pieces. Cut (4) pieces, reposition the template, and cut another (4) pieces.

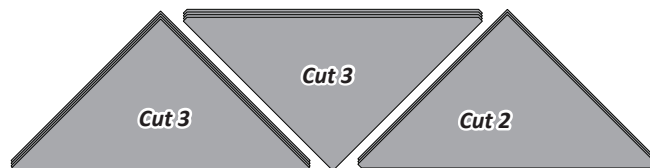
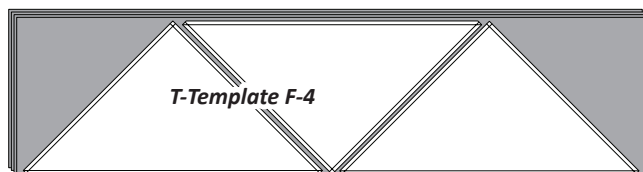
Step 3: Stack the (8) pieces beneath each template. Sew or mark the TRP lines to prepare them for curved piecing as outlined in the assembly instructions. If you choose to sew the TRP lines, you can sew a basting stitch of your preferred size through all (8) layers. When you are ready to begin the curved piecing, remove the threads and mark each fabric piece just before sewing the curved seams. Place these pieces in Bag #F4.



► Fabric F2: T-Templates F-4

Step 1: Cut (3) strips measuring 10-1/2" by 42" and (4) strips measuring 7-1/2" by 42" from Fabric F2. Stack the strips **right-side-up** into two stacks.

Step 2: Cutting T-Template F-4: Use the 10-1/2" strip to cut (8) pieces with T-Template F-4. Reposition the templates as needed for each cut. Each strip yields three pieces; for the last group, remove the top layer of fabric, then cut two pieces to complete the total for eight.



Step 3: Clip the templates to the fabric. Place them in **Bag #F4**.
