



► Illustration 2: Sewing Diagonal Rows

Step 4: Reference Assembly Illustrations 3, 4, and 5, on Page 12 for visual instructions to help you complete the Edge Blocks, including where to add *T-Template E*.

■ BORDER GEESE FOUNDATION PAPERS

Illustrations 7 to 10 show an option where Geese units can be sewn to the outside edge for an additional border. These units are part of a Geese Square Border Package that can be purchased separately from Quiltworx.com. You will need (14) geese blocks and (4) corner blocks. Paper piece the units, assemble the borders, then sew them to your table topper and press the seams as shown by the arrows. This will increase the size of the Wedding Ring Table Runner to 31" x 68" (with no outside border). An outside border (finishing at 3-1/2" wide) is provided as an option in the Geese Square Border Package. See the graphics on the following page. This would increase the topper by another 8" in each dimension, to a total of 38" x 75". Yardage for these geese and the border are provided in the table on the next page.

■ QUILTING AND BINDING

You will need 1-3/4 Yard Backing and 1/2 Yard binding to finish this project. Please reference Booklet #1 for details on how to complete the binding. There is enough to do either a Bias binding to go around the curved edges, or to finish it if you square this off. Both binding options are explained in the Intro Booklet. There is also information on digitized quilting designs in that booklet as well.

If you choose to expand this quilt to one of the larger sizes, you will need to take the length and width of the quilt, and add 8" to calculate the backing.

You will need up to 2 yards for the square up and also the option with the Geese.

If you plan to add the other border, a 42" WOF will no longer be large enough for the backing. So, you will need to piece it. We suggest 3-1/8 Yards of fabric.





► Assembly Instructions

Step 1: For all of the Unit Block 2 pieces that go around the border, add a T-Template D like Unit Block 1, instead.




Step 2: For the Unit B pieces in Unit Block 4, add a T-Template D just like you did for Unit Block Group 3.




Step 3: Your final assembly will end up with all blocks, like the Unit Block Group 5. You will have (13) finished blocks when you are done.


► **Illustration 7: Adding a Geese Border (14) Geese Units and (4) Corner Units**
